Directions to the National Equestrian Center:

From the east (St. Louis)

Take I-64 (40/61) across the Daniel Boone Bridge (Missouri River.) Continue approximately 8 miles to Lake St. Louis Blvd., at the top of the ramp turn left, the Park is about 1.5 miles down on the left hand side.
OR

Take I-70 west across the Blanchette Bridge (Missouri River,) continue approximately 7 miles to the Bryan Road exit. At the top of the ramp, go left. The road winds around (about 4.5 miles) into Hwy N. Turn right onto N and continue SW, crossing over 40/61. Go another 1 mile and we are on the right hand side. Turn right at Lake St. Louis Blvd., then right into the parking lot. We are behind Country Store/ Hawk Ridge Feed Store.

From the west (Wentzville)

Take I-70 Northeast to the 40/61 exit. Go east to the Lake St. Louis Blvd. exit (about 1 mile.) At the top of the exit ramp, go left (southeast.) The Park is 1.5 miles down on the left hand side.

From the north (Troy)

If you are on 40/61 already, then cross over I-70 and continue as noted above.

From 1-44, if you are pulling a trailer

Take 1-44 East to I-270; take 270 Northwest to I-64 (40/61) go west toward Wentzville and follow directions above.

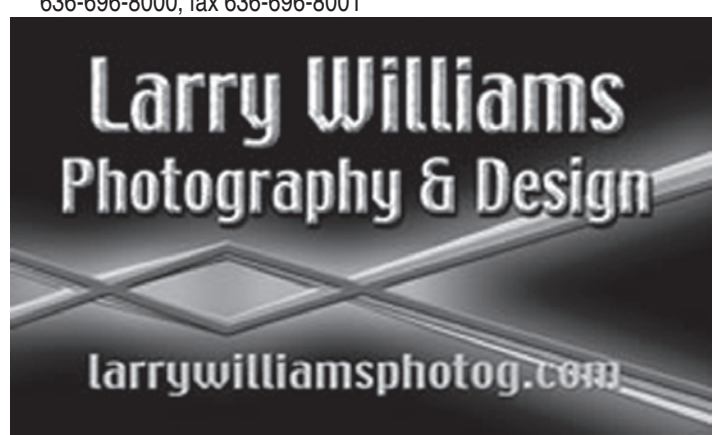
Golf Cart Rentals

General Show Rules - Please Read Carefully and Completely!

DRUG TESTING

Ponies will be randomly selected for drug testing according to the drug testing rules outlined in the 2008 OFFICIAL HANDBOOK. The random selections and collection process will be done by a licensed veterinarian. Isolated and secure samples will be sent to an industry recognized, creditable laboratory for analysis and testing. Ponies selected randomly for testing will go immediately to stalls for sample collection at the conclusion of their class. An attempt will be made to first collect urine. Should this fail, a blood sample will then be taken. Exhibitors, by rule, are required to fully cooperate and assist if their ponies are selected for drug testing.

HEALTH PAPERS

All equines must be accompanied by an official health certificate dated within 30 days of entry if the animals are over six months of age. **Also required is proof the animal has tested negative for Equine Infectious Anemia in current year (January 1, 2009 or later).** The testing laboratory and date of test must appear on the health certificate. **No animal will be allowed to unload with out proof of meeting these requirements.** No facsimiles or copies of inspection accepted.

MEASURING

All ponies will be inspected for size, color, and registration - Size by measurement or permanent height card; Color by inspection; registration by presentation of official papers. Measuring will start Saturday, July 18 beginning at 8 a.m. thru 5 p.m. in the designated area adjacent to the main arena. Measuring will also be done on Sunday, July 19 from 8 a.m. thru 12 p.m. **If you will not be arriving before 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, your entries must be submitted and paid in full prior to 5:00 p.m. Sunday, July 19 in order for your entries to count toward High Points for the show. You must measure before picking up your entry packet. You must have: 1. POA Registration Papers 2. PHC if applicable 3. Original Coggins pulled January 1, 2009 or later & Health Papers written within 30 days of entry.**

STALLS

Stalls will be assigned as completed entries are received. **ALL POAs MUST BE STALLED** (one pony per stall except for mare & foal.) and are required to pay a stall fee. Shavings are to be purchased from the facility at \$7.75 per bag, 2 bag minimum per stall. No vet slips accepted for exclusion of facility shavings purchase. **The Stall fee is \$100 plus 2 bags of shavings at \$7.75 per bag including tack stall. The stall and shavings fee is to be paid with your entry. This fee starts with arrival at 8am on Saturday July 18. No stalling will be available before 8 a.m. Thursday, July 16. Stalling on Thursday, July 16 and Friday July 17 is considered an Early Arrival and will be charged \$25 per day per stall until check in day Saturday, July 18.** Early arrivals need to make prior arrangements by calling Melissa at 660-359-1101. Everyone including early arrivals MUST stall where you have been assigned or you will be asked to move. Call 636-561-8080 to reserve your shavings in advance.

UNLOADING OF TRAILERS

Unloading must be done in the approved designated areas and at the direction of the hospitality committee. Once unloaded ALL trailers must be moved PROMPTLY to the designated trailer parking areas. If they are used for camping they must be moved to the designated camping areas.

CAMPSITES

The camping fee is \$200 (flat fee). **Camping reservations and fees must be paid and sent with entries or a \$100 penalty fee will be charged.** Campsites are available on a first come, first served basis. Electric and water are available at each campsite. **There will be absolutely no access to the camping before 8 a.m. Thursday, July 16. Camping on Thursday, July 16 and Friday, July 17 is considered an Early Arrivals must pay \$25 per day at time of pre-entry or \$50 per day at show grounds. All spots reserved early must pay this fee.** Early arrivals need to make prior arrangements by calling Melissa at 660-359-1101. A honey wagon will be available for dumping. No motorized vehicles or bicycles are allowed in the barns or buildings.

Golf Carts & Other Motorized Vehicles

Exhibitor and/or Vender golf carts and other motorized vehicles may enter barns on an as needed basis or for overnight storage **only. Licensed drivers only may operate such vehicles.** Any misuse or unsafe operation of these vehicles or violation of this rule may cause these vehicles to be impounded or confiscated from exhibitor/owner/driver.

CLASS SHEET AND ENTRY SYSTEM INFORMATION

All classes must be entered by 2 p.m. the day prior to when the class will be held (except for check-in day, Saturday, July 18). Pre-entry fees are \$12 per class. Pre-entries include all entries postmarked on or before Monday, June 15. Post-entries include all entries postmarked on or after Tuesday, June 16. Entries postmarked on or after Tuesday, June 16 will be held and processed at the show and charged post-entry fees at \$17 per class. No open checks will be accepted. Once a class is entered, it is not transferable. **Stall fees, Office fees, Equipment fees, Drug fees, Early Arrival Fees, Shavings and Pony fees to accompany entry, then the exhibitor will pay the class fees at check in.** Classes can be added all week as long as the entry time deadline is met. New pony/rider numbers can be issued all week, but will not count towards any high point awards if issued after the last day and time of measuring and check-in, Sunday, July 19 at 1:00 p.m. **Board Of Directors Clarification is as follows: Pre-Entry;** Any entry that is postmarked before the published deadline and the class has been entered on the pre-entry form. **Post-Entry;** Any entry made after the published deadline. This includes any additional classes entered on any pony/rider combination that had come in as a pre-entry. For example: You sent in your entries post-marked before the pre-entry deadline and only entered half your classes at that time. Any and all classes you enter after that time will be charged the post-entry fee. **Any class that is scratched after check in will be at the exhibitor's expense. Scratches made during check in will not be charged to the exhibitor.** If you scratch a class, you must contact the show

office the day prior to your class. If this is not possible, you must notify the warm-up arena at least three classes in advance. Refunds for class fees are only given in the case of illness or injury to rider or pony, and must be accompanied by a doctors or veterinarian note. Stall fees, Office fees, Drug fees, Pony fees, Equipment fees and a \$15.00 processing fee are NOT refundable.

WARM-UP BEFORE CLASSES

There will be a 10 minute warm-up before the following classes: Yearling Longe Line, Two-Year-Old Longe Line, JPFC Hunter Under Saddle Classes (Two-year-olds and Three- and Four-Year Olds), JPFC Western Pleasure Classes (Two-year-olds and Three- and Four-Year Olds), International Futurity Classes, Leonard Lewis Memorial Youth Futurity, Daniels HUS Futurity and McClaren Western Pleasure Futurity.

SHOW SCHEDULE AND "A" SHOW POINTS

Every effort will be made to hold classes as scheduled. A second and third arena will be used for gymkhana and trail classes. **PLEASE NOTICE START TIME FOR ALL ARENAS.** Large classes will be divided at the Judges discretion. Points will be awarded in final classes only for High Point Awards. International points are awarded on final card placings only. **** (A) show points are awarded to each individual judges card for Register Of Merit points once the show is entered at the National Office.** Clarification: 3 Sets of A show points will be awarded in all classes except for halter championships.** The Show Committee reserves the right to not call a class after 9:30 p.m. If classes scheduled any day are not completed that day, the Show Committee will reschedule them, post and announce the new schedule.

BREEDERS CLASSES

Mare and Foal, Get of Sire, and Produce of Dam require an additional form which must be completed when you pick up your show packet. Post entries are permitted in these classes (no late fee) if ponies have been entered in at least one other class in the show at the time entries are closed. Class entry forms are available upon request from the Show Office.

EQUITATION AND HORSEMANSHIP PATTERNS

Patterns are mandatory for Showmanship, Western Horsemanship, Bareback Horsemanship, and Hunt Seat Equitation. All Horsemanship and Equitation classes are pattern work only. No call back for rail work. All patterns will be included in the show packet.

8 AND UNDER WALK/TROT PLEASURE CLASSES

youth can not cross enter in three gaited 8 and under pleasure classes and the new 8 and under walk/trot pleasure classes. And the 8 and under walk/trot pleasure classes will not count for Hi-point awards. Rules 97.C. and 99.F.

8 & UNDER JUMPING

8 and under International over Fence classes, Hunter over Fences and Equitation over Fence courses will be simple courses that include cross-rails and verticals no higher than 18 inches. Open Jumping may include gates and flowers, but will be no higher than 24 inches for the first round.

BACK NUMBERS

The Show Office will issue two numbers to be worn, one on each side of the pony in all mounted classes including: Trail, Costume, Western Riding, Western Horsemanship, Leadline Horsemanship, Western Pleasure, Reining, Hunter Under Saddle, Hunt Seat Equitation, JPFC & all Over Fences classes, and all Gaming classes.

GRADUATION CEREMONY

The Graduation Ceremony will be held on Tuesday, July 21. Any graduate who wants to participate should complete the graduate form included in the entry information and turn it in with the show entries or no later than noon on Tuesday. Graduate speeches must be limited to 250 words maximum.

MCCLAREN FUTURITY

This will be held on Wednesday, July 22 in the evening. For information, contact the National POAC Office at (317) 788-0107.

LEONARD LEWIS YOUTH MEMORIAL FUTURITY

This will be held on Tuesday, July 21 in the evening. For information contact the National POAC Office at (317) 788-0107.

KEITH DAVIS MEMORIAL FUTURITY

This will be held on Wednesday, July 22 in the evening. An award will be presented to the two- and three-year-old Western Pleasure Futurity winner, 18 and under.

DANIELS JUNIOR PONY HUNTER UNDER SADDLE FUTURITY

Important High Point Information - Please read carefully and completely...

Overall High Point Pony Awards

These Overall Awards will include all approved POA classes of the show judged on the pony. **The following classes DO NOT count towards the High Point Pony Award: Equitation, Showmanship, Adult and Youth Pleasure Driving, Leadline Costume, Most Colorful, Longe Line. Lead-In classes and Futurity classes.** Any number of riders may ride the pony. However, if the pony is ridden in different class divisions of the same event, designation prior to the show must be made as to which pony/rider combination will receive points if earned. The words "class division" means all age groups and sex groups of any class. The following classes will count toward High Point Pony Awards: 1,2,6,9-23,25-33,35-45,74,75,77-80,88,89,92-96,98,100,102-104,106-112,115, 116, 119, 120,123,124,127,129-163.

High Point Stakes Awards

The High Point Pony Stakes Awards are broken down into three categories: High Point Mare Stake, High Point Stallion Stake, and High Point Gelding Stake. Awards will be presented to the High Point Pony 46-51", 51-54" and 54-56" in each sex division. To be eligible for the stakes awards you **MUST participate** in the appropriate halter class, you do not have to place, just participate. The following classes will count toward High Point Stakes Awards: 1,2,6,9-23,25-33,35-45,74,75,77-80,88,89,92-96,98, 100,102-104,106-112,115,116,119,120,123,124,127,129-163.

High Point Mare (The Andreas Family Award): Traveling mare trophy in honor of "Little White Mare" goes to the overall high point mare.

High Point Stallion (The Gene & Carol

Salisbury): Picture plaque goes to the overall high point stallion.

High Point Gelding (The Agee Family Memorial

Gelding Award): Awarded to the Gelding receiving the highest point computation. **Except the following**

classes: Halter, Most Colorful, Adult & Youth Cart, and Any Costume Classes.

High Point Rider Award (multiple pony):

All riders must designate prior to the show if they want to compete for this High Point Rider Award. This award includes all approved POAC classes in which the same rider placed, regardless of the number of ponies that the rider exhibits in the different classes. **The following classes DO NOT COUNT towards the High Point Rider Award: Halter, Most Colorful, Adult and Youth Pleasure Driving, Leadline Costume, Lunge Line, Lead-In classes and Futurity classes.** If a rider rides two or more ponies in one event, a designation form must be completed prior to the show indicating which pony/rider combination will receive points if earned, or no points will count for the rider or the rider's ponies in that event. **Undesignated riders will automatically be competing for the one pony/one rider awards.**

The following classes will count toward High Point Rider Awards: 1,2,6,9-13,54-59,61-63,70-72,74,75,77-80,82-89,92-96,98-124,127,129-163.

High Point One Pony/One Rider Award:

This award will include all approved POAC classes entered by the same pony/rider combination, including Halter, Equitation, and all Performance classes **EXCEPT: Most Colorful, Adult and Youth Pleasure Driving, Leadline Costume, Longe Line, Lead-In classes and Futurity classes.**

Awards will be presented in the following categories: One Pony/One Rider High Point, One Pony/One Rider Reserve High Point, and One Pony/One Rider third-sixth place in the following age groups: 8&Under Boy, 8&Under Girl, 9-12 Boy, 9-12 Girl, 13-18 Boy and 13-18 Girl. The following classes will count toward High Point One Pony/One Rider Award: 1,2,6,9-23,25-33,35-45,54-59,61-63,67,68,70-72,74,75,77-80,82-89,92-96,98-124,127,129-163.

High Point Timed Events Pony

This award is presented to the High Point Timed Events pony in the following three age groups: 8&Under, 9-12, and 13-18. The following classes count toward High Point Timed Events Pony: 131-163.

High Point 18 & Under Equitation Award

This award is presented to the High Point and Reserve High Point 18 & Under exhibitors who receive the most points in Showmanship, Bareback Horsemanship, Western Horsemanship, Hunt Seat Equitation and Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences. The following Classes count toward High Point 18 & U Eq. Award: 54-59,61-63,67,68,70-72,82-87,99,101,105,113,114,117,118,121,122.

High Point Junior Pony Award

This award is presented to the Overall High Point Junior Pony in the following classes: Junior Western Pleasure, Junior Hunter Under Saddle, Junior Trail and Junior Reining. The following classes will count: 9,75,96,112.

High Point Junior Rail Pony Award

This award is presented to the Junior Pony earning the most points in the following events: Western Pleasure, Junior Western Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle, Junior Hunter Under Saddle, Trail, Junior Trail, Western Riding, Reining, Junior Reining, and Costume. The following classes will count toward High Point Junior Rail Pony Award: 1,2, 6, 9, 11-13,75,77-79,88,89,92-96,110-112, 115,116,119,120,123,124, 129,130.

High Point Junior Pony Futurity Classic Award

These awards will be presented to the Overall High Point JPFC Two Year Old and High Point JPFC Three & Four Year Old ponies from the following classes: 4,5,60,64,69,73.

Sportsmanship Award Cyril Nyre Memorial Award:

Annual sportsmanship award donated by the POAC. An **anonymous** designated committee will be selected to determine the winner. Exhibitors will be evaluated throughout duration of the week.

Dwight Sharpton Special Award

This award is presented to the Reining 13-18 Class winner and donated by the Australian Palouse Pony Association.

Other Special Awards:

Dr. Fowler B. Poling Memorial Trophy:

Awarded to the Grand Champion Stallion.

Iowa Recognition Award:

Presented to the Grand Champion Mare.

Leonard Lewis Memorial Award: Presented to the Grand Champion Gelding and sponsored by the Minnesota POAC.

Charles Parker Adult Pleasure Driving Award:

Presented to the Adult Pleasure Driving class winner and sponsored by the Indiana POAC.

The Ivy Lane Performance Pony Award:

18 & Under one pony/one rider combination award. Class numbers are: 1,2,6,11-13,77-79,88,89,92-95,115,116,119,120,123,124,131-133,146-151,155-160.

SPORTSMANSHIP

Any person acting or inciting or permitting any other to act in a manner contrary to the Rules of the POAC, or in a manner deemed unsportsmanlike, improper, unethical, dishonest, or intemperate, or prejudicial to the best interests of the POAC, shall be reported to the POAC and subject to disciplinary procedures. Reminder in all classes requiring an order of go or classes having multiple cuts they will be posted no later than the morning of that days events.

If you miss your turn in the order of go or miss your cut you WILL NOT be allowed to participate in the class.

- A. The class is shown in four divisions, each will be judged in accordance with the applicable 2009 POAC Rules for such events. Order of events: Jumping, Hunter Under Saddle, Western Pleasure, and Barrels.
- B. Judges will select ten (10) placings in each event and ribbons will be awarded at the conclusion of each event.
- C. Every entry must show in all four (4) events and may have one rider only for each event. No rider may show more than one pony. Riders must be designated to the Show Committee prior to the class. No change of rider from the one designated rider will be permitted except in case of illness or injury. Riders must be age 18 or under. Points will be awarded based on placings in each event: Twenty-four (24) points for First, Twenty-three (23) points for Second, Twenty-two (22) points for Third, Twenty-one (21) points for Fourth, Twenty (20) points for Fifth, Nineteen (19) points for Sixth, Eighteen (18) points for Seventh, Seventeen (17) points for Eight, Sixteen (16) points for Ninth, & Fifteen (15) points for Tenth. The winner of the POA Versatility Class will be the pony accumulating the most points in the four events combined. Lower placings will be similarly determined. In the event of a tie in the number of points accumulating the following tie breakers will be used in order shown, until the tie is broken: (1) Pony placing in the most events; (2) Pony winning the most events, then most seconds, etc.; (3) Entry with the fastest time in the barrel race event.
- E. All necessary tack or appointment changes will be made in the show ring. Two assistants will be permitted in the show ring for tack changes. All changes must be made within the five minute interval between events or the entry will be eliminated. No pony will be permitted to leave the ring after the event starts without the permission of the Judge or the Show Committee.
- F. There will be a meeting prior to the Versatility Class. All rules and procedures will be reviewed at this meeting. Exhibitors running order will be established by a draw for Jumping and Barrels. Meeting time will be designated by the Show Committee and all participants will be notified to time and place.
- G. Exhibitors are cautioned to guard their tack and appointments against loss and theft. The Show Committee can not be responsible for them.
- H. The Versatility Class will be limited to twenty-five (25) entries; therefore, the first twenty-five (25) PAID entries will be those participating in this event. Fees for entries received after the class is filled will be refunded.
